SCHOOL SPOTLIGHT

Learning Green at San Pedro High

Thanks to dedicated Science Teacher Jennifer Cheng, San Pedro High School is a leader in Sustainability. Students participate in field trips, science fairs, community service opportunities and competitions, and are passionate about environmental stewardship.

SPHS biology students won first place for a video contest with a video showing them conducting wetlands experiments. The contest is co-sponsored by the Prince William Network and USDA Forest Service, which netted them a \$1,000 cash prize, which they used for a field trip.

Students from SPHS also participated in the Student Climate & Conservation Congress ("Sc3"), a week-long program presented by Green Schools Alliance which brings together student sustainability leaders from across the country. Held each year at the National Conservation Training Center, Sc3 empowers students with the skills, knowledge and tools to address environmental challenges and better serve their schools and communities.

Six LAUSD Campuses Selected for Drought Response Outreach Program

Six LAUSD campuses were selected by the State Water Resources Controls Broad (SWRCB) to receive \$6 million in funding for Drought Response Outreach Program for Schools (DROPS) projects. The DROPS program aims to create Low Impact Development (LID) site features that serve to capture, treat, and infiltrate storm water into groundwater basins to mimic a natural watershed. These features, or Best Management Practices (BMPs), include bio swales, permeable pavement, infiltration galleries, raingardens, and cisterns. Through partnership with the Council for Watershed Health, TreePeople, and Los Angeles Audubon Society, the LID features will also serve as outdoor, experiential classrooms and learning laboratories that can be incorporated into the curriculum and activities at school. Programs include field trips, student leadership training, professional development, teacher trainings, and formation of eco-clubs in schools.

The six schools, Belvedere ES, Markham MS, Normandie ES, Northridge MS, Victory ES,

and Webster MS, were selected for consideration though the Maintenance & Operations Critical repair program. Projects will be implemented over the next three years.

COMPETITIONS & CONTESTS

<u>Think.Eat.Save Student Challenge</u> - Asks students to uncover how much food is being wasted at their school and develop a plan to reduce waste. Win up to \$5,000 by coming up with the best plan for your school. Deadline to submit is November 16, 2015.

Made By Milk 2015 Carton Construction Contest - Prizes given to best art pieces made from milk cartons gathered on school campus. Deadline to submit project is November 18, 2015

Grants

<u>Annie's Grants for School Gardens</u> - provides funding for school and community gardens. Application for 2016 grant becomes live in early October 2015.

<u>Lowe's Toolbox for Education</u> - provides between \$2,000 and \$5,000 for projects that enhance the schoolyard and encourage parent and community involvement. Spring 2016 grant cycle opens December 18, 2015.

<u>Sow It Forward Garden Grant</u> - Schools building and maintaining edible gardens can apply for up to \$500. Applications accepted until January 2016.

<u>Captain Planet Foundation EcoTech Grants</u> - up to \$2,500 to engage students in inquiry-based STEM projects that address environmental problems in their communities.

Applications accepted January 1, 2016 through April 30, 2016.

<u>Captain Planet Foundation Small Grants</u> - between \$500 - \$2,500 for student projects that have real environmental outcomes. Deadline for fall/winter projects is January 31, 2016.

ClimateChangeLive - Climate-related educational webcasts, webinars, electronic field trips and online resources for students and teachers.

EarthEcho International - Online resources and youth and educator outreach and support using service learning to empower young people to become environmental leaders.

<u>Forest Service Conservation Education</u> - Educator website with extensive resources and links.

<u>NatureLIVE</u> - distance learning adventures through webcasts, webinars, and online education resources.

<u>EPA Climate Change</u> - Learn the science behind climate change. Also has an award winning student site.
